### 1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

### 2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with the Headteacher, Dominic Knill, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

### 3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items
- Considering cheaper alternatives to school-branded items, such as logos that can be ironed on, as long as this doesn't compromise quality and durability
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signaling differences in groups for interschool competitions, such as creating posters or labels
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

## 4. Expectations for school uniform

### 4.1 Our school's uniform

Our school uniform consists of:

- Navy blue crew-neck sweatshirt/jumper (embroidered school logo is optional)
- Blue polo shirt (embroidered school logo is optional)
- Grey trousers/shorts or pinafore dress/skirt or a blue-checked summer dress
- Black, grey, navy or white socks or navy or grey tights
- Suitable black shoes

PE kit consists of:

- House-colour cotton t-shirt and navy shorts (**not lycra short shorts**. Any lycra shorts must be **at least** mid-thigh length)
- Trainers (not daps)
- Dark-coloured tracksuit trousers and a warm sweatshirt
- Shin pads and long socks (for years 3 to 6) – *only for specific lessons*

PE kit should only be worn on days when a class has a PE lesson or the pupil is attending a sporting/active extra-curricular club.

For swimming, the expectation is that children will wear:

- Close-fitting swimwear, trunks or a single-piece costume and swim cap (optional)

Examples of the school uniform can be found in Appendix 1.

## 4.2 Footwear

All pupils are required to wear flat, plain black shoes or trainers without logos. These should be closed in with no toes visible.

For health and safety reasons, we do not allow pupils to wear shoes with platform soles, Heelys or high heels. If boots are worn these should also be flat and plain black. Sandals and flip-flops are not permitted.

## 4.3 Jewellery, Hair Ornaments, Watches, Make-up and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons, **we do not allow** children to wear jewellery. The exception to this rule small studs for children with pierced ears.

Children are required to remove any items (including earrings) for all Physical Education (PE) activities (including swimming) to prevent them from causing injury. Your child's class teacher will advise you when PE lessons are to take place so earrings can be removed. Please note: Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings.

Hair bands, ribbons/bows or 'scrunchies' can be worn, but should be plain.

Make up and nail varnish **must not be worn** to school unless for an agreed special event, for example a school disco or a Break the Rules day. This requirement is in place to maintain the school's focus on learning, uphold safeguarding standards, and promote a culture of equality and respect.

Watches may be worn to school. However, they must be removed for PE lessons.

The school is unable to take any responsibility for any lost items.

## 4.4 Weather adaptations

In cold and or wet weather, particularly in the winter months, children are expected to wear coats and are permitted to wear a hat/ear-muffs, scarf and gloves when outside. They are not permitted to be worn when inside the building.

## 4.5 Naming of uniform

All items of uniform should be clearly named. This is to ensure that any missing items can be returned to their rightful owners. This is made more difficult when items are not named.

## 4.5 Where to purchase school uniform

Our branded school uniform can be purchased from a number of different providers but non-branded alternatives can be purchased from a number of high-street retailers.

# 5. Expectations for our school community

## 5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school

- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

## 5.2 Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Parents are also expected to contact the Headteacher if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

## 5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply, but will follow up with the headteacher if the situation doesn't improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be dealt with by a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

## 5.4 Governors

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils

The board will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts at least every 5 years.

## 6. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed every 3 years by the Headteacher and senior leaders. At every review, it will be approved by the Full Governing Body.
