We will be learning about both the human and physical characteristics of the United Kingdom, focussing on the capital city, London.

What I know and can explain

A landmark marks important places and can often be seen from far away

A city is the largest type of settlement with the most houses, people, shops and other buildings

The capital city of the United Kingdom is London and is the largest settlement

Physical features are made by nature. They include hills, mountains, beaches and ocean

A location is a place or the position of something.

The Great Fire of London happened in 1666. It started in a bakery and spread across much of London.

Useful Vocabulary

Bakery - A place where bread, cakes and pastries are made and sold

Capital city - A city that is home to the government and ruler of a country

Cathedral - A large, important church

City - A settlement, often with a cathedral

Human feature - Human-made features, such as buildings, roads and bridges

Monument - A large structure built to remember a person or event

Physical feature - Naturally-formed features, such as cliffs, rivers and forests
