What I know and can explain

A timeline is a display of events, people or objects in chronological order

A timeline can show different periods of time, from a few years to millions of years

Neil Armstrong was the first person to walk on the Moon in 1969. This event started a new era of space exploration.

Explorers' modes of transport have changed over time. For example, early explorers used sailing ships and modern explorers use rockets

William Wilberforce was a British activist who successfully campaigned for the abolition of the slave trade in the 19th century

Emmeline Pankhurst was a British activist who successfully campaigned for women's voting rights in the 20th century

Rosa Parks was a 20th century activist who campaigned for the rights of black people in the United States

Useful Vocabulary

Activist - A person who feels strongly about helping people, other living things or the planet

Campaign - A planned set of activities to reach a goal

Discovery - The act of finding something that had not been known before

Explorer - A person who travels to places to find out what is there

Fact - Something which is true and can be proven

Monarch - A king or queen who rules a kingdom

Opinion - what something believes or thinks about something

Protest - To disagree with something and complain strongly

Rights - The things that a person is entitled to have

Significant - A person who is great, important or worthy of attention

Timeline - a way of showing the order of events in the past
