Year 1 – Human Senses



In this topic, we will be learning about humans, some of our body parts and similarities and differences with other animals. We will also be learning about our senses.

What I know and can explain

Humans are living things. They belong to a group of animals called mammals

Humans normally have the same body parts

Humans look different from each other

The basic body parts are the head, arms, legs, nose, eyes, ears, mouth, hands and feet

Different animal groups have some common body parts

Humans

Humans are a type of animal called a mammal. Mammals have limbs, such as arms and legs, and hair or fur on their bodies. Other mammals include cats, elephants and apes.

Useful Vocabulary

Ankle - A hinged body part that connects the leg to the foot

Human - A mammal with four limbs (two arms and two legs) that walks in an upright position

Limb - An arm, leg, wing or flipper of an animal

Mammal - An animal that has fur or hair and four limbs

Sense - The ability to understand the environment, such as sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch

Unique - Unlike anything else
