Year 1 – Plant Parts



We will be learning about both wild plants and those we grow in our gardens by exploring the local environment. We will be observing and describing the basic parts of these plants.

What I know and can explain

Plants are important because they provide food, shelter and materials for animals, including humans

Changes happen to plants across the four seasons

The basic plant parts include root, stem, leaf, flower, petal and fruit

Plants grow from seeds or bulbs

Useful Vocabulary

Blossom - A small flower, or lots of small flowers, on a plant that can develop into fruit

Bud - A part of a plant that develops into a flower or leaf

Deciduous - A tree that loses all its leaves in autumn and grows new ones in spring

Evergreen - A tree that sheds old leaves and grows new leaves all year round

Hedgerow - A row of shrubs and trees that grow close together

Meadow - A field where grasses and wildflowers grow

Season - One of the four periods of the year, which are spring, summer, autumn and winter

Woodland - An area of land that is covered with trees
